2010-2011 TUITION

Tuition statements were mailed on June 10, 2010. **TUITION IS DUE BY JULY 16, 2010.** A late fee of \$25 will be applied after July 20th.

2010-2011 STUDENT PARKING PERMITS

All students driving to St. Ursula Academy must park their vehicles in the SUA lot and display an SUA parking permit. Parking permits will be sold to all student drivers on August 12th from 11:05 am–11:30 am and August 13th from 1:35 pm–2:00 pm. Parking fees are as follows:

- Full Year - \$75.00
- Terms 3 & 4 - \$45.00
- Terms 2, 3 & 4 - \$60.00
- Term 4 - \$30.00

A valid vehicle license plate number must be presented when purchasing your permit. Students will not be permitted to park in the lot after August 16th without a permit.

UNIFORM SHOES

Please refer to the following policy when shopping for school shoes: Low-heeled leather shoes in solid black, brown, navy or tan are acceptable, as are saddle shoes. Backless shoes with a closed toe are permitted. Boots, flip-flops, sandals, canvas or fur-trimmed shoes are not acceptable. Moccasin-style loafers must have a sole and be without beading or fur/Sherpa lining.

ST. URSULA ACADEMY CHRISTIAN SERVICE PROGRAM

“...whatever you did for one of the least [people] of mine, you did for me.”

Mt. 25:40

The Christian Service Program at St. Ursula Academy is designed to help students develop a habit of concern and action for the good of all people, in response to the teaching of the Gospel, and a living-out of our baptism. To this end, we look to St. Angel Merici, foundress of the Ursulines as our guide. Angela spent her life reaching out to women, children, and families suffering from the injustices of her time, and inspiring other women to do the same. For Angela, service was **living** the Gospel. It is central to the mission of St. Ursula Academy, and to the spiritual growth of every Christian.

During a student's first three years at St. Ursula, she is required to engage in a variety of service projects. These acts of service should expand her awareness of those in need and develop her skills in responding to their needs. A crucial part of the growth process is to reflect upon her service, and to express it in writing. This reflection allows her to discover its impact on her own life and to realize the joy and grace that God can bring to her through her service efforts and the people working with her.

GOALS

1. To encourage the student to see the value of service and the contribution she can make to society and the local community following in the spirit of St. Angela Merici.
2. To help the student broaden her personal vision of the work of social justice as modeled in the Scriptures.
3. To create a positive association and working spirit between St. Ursula Academy and local agencies serving those in need in the community at large.
4. To foster personal growth as the student uses her time, talent, and resources to serve others, and to encourage the student to find meaningful service utilizing her individual and unique abilities and interests.

BASIC SERVICE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

1. **SIXTY (60) HOURS** (minimum) - may be accumulated in one place or with several qualifying activities. An extended commitment in one agency, school, nursing home, etc. is encouraged, especially as the student enters her junior and senior years. The majority of students exceed the required hours as they find meaningful and fulfilling opportunities.
2. **EXPECTATION** - 20 hours by the end of her freshman year, 20 hours by the end of her sophomore year, and 20 hours by the end of her junior year.
3. **COMPLETION TIME** - *hours completed during the summer prior to freshman year may be counted. ALL HOURS ARE DUE BY THE END OF JUNIOR YEAR!* Each year all hours must be completed by June 1st. To run for Student Council, hours must be completed by May 1st.
4. **DOCUMENTATION** of service hours will be tracked by the Coordinators of Christian Service. Forms must be:
 - Signed by a parent/guardian and include all requested information.
 - Completed soon after the service has been rendered, never later than the end of the school year.
 - Written reflection is essential.
 - In an extended commitment, the service form with reflection may be turned in after each ten hours served and at the conclusion of the project.
5. **SERVICE MUST BE TO PEOPLE** - Exceptions:
 - Pet therapy programs—taking animals to nursing homes/day care for residents (within an established program).
 - Horseback riding lessons for physically/mentally challenged persons, for example, Vail Meadows.
 - Training of assistance animals (see Assistance Dogs of America).

6. **EXAMPLES OF SERVICE AREAS** - the poor, the needy, the elderly, the sick and infirm; soup kitchens, food banks, schools, churches/parishes, nursing homes, after-school programs; **non-profit** organizations and events that focus around a **cause** (Salvation Army, muscular dystrophy, Habitat for Humanity, etc.). Expressions of Corporal Works of Mercy are excellent starting points (feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, give drink to the thirsty, visit the sick, etc.).

EXAMPLES OF AREAS WHICH WOULD NOT FIT THE SERVICE DESCRIPTION - volunteering for political campaigns, volunteering for family members, times of worship (service at Mass, ushering, etc.), any volunteer time for corporations, companies, or individuals whose purpose is financial gain or profit (for example, teaching dance lessons at a dance studio, filing papers in an office). Please note: simply doing something without pay does not necessarily qualify as Christian Service under these guidelines. Generally speaking, ideas for service should be approved before beginning.

For additional ideas or assistance, see a Coordinator of Christian Service.

7. **SERVICE REQUIREMENT is not considered complete until all required paperwork and reflections are submitted and accepted.**

Some sports hold summer conditioning sessions and/or open gyms. Please contact the appropriate coach below if you are interested in participating or have any questions.



The SUA SCRIP program will be operational over the summer. Orders placed with payment by 9:00 a.m. Monday morning will be processed and available for pick-up in the Main Office by noon on Thursday. The only exception will be during the week of June 28th. No orders will be processed this week. Any orders placed will be available for pick-up the week of July 12th. The Main Office is closed each Friday during the summer and the entire week of July 5th.

DID YOU KNOW . . . SCRIP DOLLARS CAN BE USED FOR COLLEGE TUITION?

Even once your daughter has graduated from St. Ursula Academy, you can use the SUA SCRIP program to earn money toward college tuition. If interested, log into your SCRIP account and append the school name to the end of your daughter's name THEN change the address from your home address to that of the college or university. Submit questions to scrip@toledosua.org.

Summer travel is a good occasion to utilize the SCRIP program. A little planning can go a long way to earning dollars toward your daughter's tuition.
