- Specific Textbook support. Many of the textbooks in use at SUA have online sites for study help. Ex: glencoe.com has the textbook in use at SUA for World History. Select student/parent, select Ohio, select Social Studies, click on the + by High School World History, click on the + by previous editions, select World History 2005. Under chapter activities select chapter overviews, choose a unit, choose a chapter, and a summary of each section of the chapter is available, as well as flash cards, and practice quizzes.
